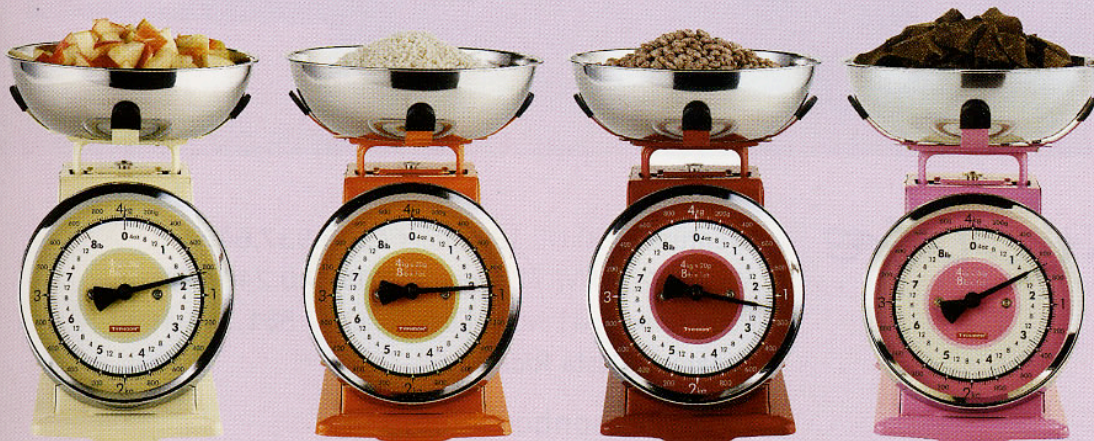


## A MODEL IDEA
